From Fr. Jim . . .

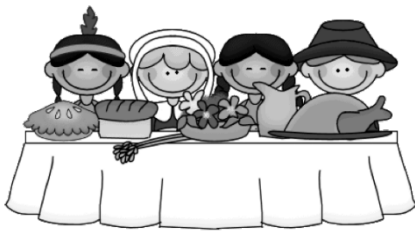
