The purpose of the CLOW program is to provide the children with an age-appropriate but up close experience with our Lord through the Sunday liturgy. This year we will be using new class materials and each child will receive a worksheet to take home with them. Our CLOW time will more closely resemble the structure of the mass, but at their level. Our hope is that each family will also use the work sheets to deepen their experience, talk about it throughout the week or practice the bible verses through memory, songs and actions.

One other blessing of the CLOW time is that the adults have an opportunity to experience a quiet liturgy in the sanctuary. We try so very hard to have the children come back upstairs in a peaceful and sacred manner but realize that it doesn't always happen so we appreciate your patience. Help us by reinforcing that behavior in each child when you talk with them at home.
