From Fr. Jim . . .

Welcome to Everyone at home, watching live stream and to those who can be present in church with us as we continue to battle the pandemic. Whether from your home or in church, it is right and just that we gather to celebrate the Eucharist on this the last day of the Easter Season and the birthday of the Church of God. Our church community resembles the first Pentecost. I feel about this Feast like I do the Feast of the Epiphany. If we did not bear the name St. Leo the Great, these two Feasts are so appropriate for being our parish feast days.

How evident are we of belonging to the Lord, of being filled with the Holy Spirit, of being sent to proclaim the Good news to all the nations, and of having different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit?
