

From Fr. Jim . . .

We are baptized and baptize others with these very words and in the name of the Trinity. God gifts us with divine life and love and we share God's life and love always in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. So, on this wonderful Feast, let us pray: Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning is now and will be forever! Amen. Alleluia!!

Congratulations to all who are graduating. We ask God's blessings on all who are graduating this year. We need them and we want them to grow with us in serving the Lord.

We remember all those who served in the military and have died and all those who are still serving our country in the military and fighting for our freedom. To those who have gone before us, may God grant you eternal rest, peace, and blessings forever. To those who are serving our country and have served our country, gratitude, prayers, and peace, always.

An end in sight?! Beginning with the weekend of June 5 and June 6, the Bishops of Ohio have reinstated the obligation to attend Sunday Mass or the Saturday Vigil Mass and Mass on Holy Days. I believe on June 2, Governor DeWine is removing the restrictions of social distancing and wearing masks for those who are fully vaccinated. After the statewide mandate is lifted, there will be no mask mandate for churches of the archdiocese. However, there will still be one section in church reserved for those who still need to social distance and wear masks. I continue to encourage everyone who is eligible to receive the vaccine to do so, for your own health and everyone's freedom.

As has always been the case, those who have a serious reason are exempt from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. This includes those who are ill, have significant health risk factors or care for someone who is immuno-compromised, or ill, as well as those who have significant fear or anxiety of contracting coronavirus in a large group of persons.

We will be working hard at St. Leo's to restore our liturgies back to its fullest expression and to welcome you back with great joy and eagerness.




