## 30th Sunday of Ordinary Time - October 24, 2021

#### From Fr. Jim. . .

Beacons of Light: Thank you all so much for your participation, responses, comments, suggestions concerning the groupings of parishes of families in the Beacons of Light process. I assure you that this is a consultative process and this phase – hearing from the faithful, the voice of the people - is so important in determining the final and official groupings of families of parishes. The steering committee for Beacons of Light received thousands of responses from the faithful throughout the Archdiocese. Based on the comments received, changes will be made again to the groupings of the families and presented to Archbishop Schnurr for final approval. This part of the process should be complete by the end of November.

This expansive process of change requires continuous prayer. Prayer support is necessary to discern the Spirit's guidance and to allow the Spirit to be the guiding force that helps us to do God's will for the good of the entire Church of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. You can find prayer suggestions on the Beacons of Light web page: Beaconsaoc.org.

Especially as we continue with the technicalities and details of the process and with every phase of the process of Beacons of Light it is important to keep our eyes on the finish line. We can't forget the desired outcomes of the plan such as we no longer want our parishes just to be maintained but fully alive with the mission of our Lord and Savior. We want our churches full again for worship and Sunday Eucharist with vibrant expressions of faith. We want people to seek the sacraments of the church and we want the church to be on fire with a new evangelization that takes the Gospel to the people with welcome, hospitality, challenge, conversion, and faith. We want to be the Body of Christ alive with the spiritual and corporal works of mercy and with passion to work for peace and justice.

It is important that our parishes go beyond the basics and the minimum of faith to develop deep relationships with the Lord. Last Sunday's Gospel asked us to become servants in imitation of the master who came to serve and not be served. As servants, we embrace human weakness and suffering together with solidarity, compassion, mercy, empathy, and grace. We put the needs of others before our own and we learn that those who hand over their lives so that others can live will receive "a hundred times more new life in this present age and eternal life to come." This, I believe, is the desire of Beacons of Light for the Church of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

Let us pray: Lord, take us beyond the basics into deeper relationship with you. Free your church and our parishes to be beacons of light that radiate the presence of Christ inclusively, generously, fully, abundantly, unconditionally, resourcefully, responsibly, and sacramentally. Bless us with new life and growth for the praise and glory of your name now and forever.
