



PASTOR'S PONDERINGS . . .

Dearest Friends.

I am ordained forty-three years and appreciative for that many years of wonderful priestly ministry for the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. Also, in November of this year, I will celebrate seventy years of life. July 1st I would be pastor of St. Leo for 15 years. Effective July 1st, I am retiring but I will be available for weekend help especially for our family of parishes formed by the Beacons of Light process. I will preside at the 10:30am Sunday liturgy at St. Leo and the 4pm Saturday Liturgy at St. Boniface at least for the next fiscal year and until our new parish family

receives its full complement of priestly help and any way that I can be of assistance until the new parish plan is developed and actively in place. For me personally, I know it is time to retire from parish leadership and I look forward to helping as needed with sacraments and ministry on a more leisurely schedule.

Father Rodolfo Coaquira, MCCJ will be the pastor and he will have two parochial vicars (associate pastors) to assist him. All three priests are Comboni Missionaries. They speak **English and Spanish and some** African dialects. Their love for the Lord and God's people is obvious in

their thirst for social justice and peace, their promotion of the spiritual and corporal works of mercy, and their hospitality to the immigrant and refugee.

I want to thank you for befriending us and for your most generous support of our work and ministry. We have been partners in grace and together the Lord has made his presence known and felt with your prayers and with sharing your time, talent, and treasure. With your help, the kingdom of God is alive and well in North Fairmount! Eucharist is being celebrated and lived, the Gospel is being preached, children and adults are being baptized and/or completing their initiation into the church, people are fed, clothed, welcomed, the lowly are raised, the youth are formed and instructed in the faith and invited to join ministry and service activities. Our saving God is praised and worshipped by all.

"We don't know what our future holds, but we know who holds our future." God still has plenty of work for us to



do. It has been a privilege and an immense blessing to share this ministry with you. Humbly, I ask you to continue journeying with St. Leo and our family of parishes with your


> prayers and support and in whatever ways the Lord calls you to follow him with the work we do in his name. Thanks for being God's church with us. Let's keep each other in prayer.

BEACONS OF LIGHT UPDATE

From the beginning of time, the Holy Spirit has been at work with the Father and the Son on the divine plan for our salvation. Through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at our baptism, we are each called to be cooperators with that plan, not only for our own sanctification, but for the sanctification of the whole world. The Catholic Church is God's sacramental presence on earth, imbued with the Holy Spirit, given to us as a means for our

salvation. All the resources of the Church – human, physical, financial – must be ordered to Jesus' great commission to proclaim the Good News of salvation and make disciples of all nations.

This is the purpose of Beacons of Light, to best enable the proclamation of the Gospel in our own archdiocese.

On July 1, we will move on to the next major phase of Beacons of Light, implementation of the new Families of Parishes and the start of intentional pastoral planning within each of those Families. This planning will be rooted in sincere prayer and open collaboration as each Family together discerns the best and highest use of their shared resources to radiate the love of Christ and form a strong, vital community of evangelization and service centered on the Eucharist. There will undoubtedly be hard decisions involving sacrifice and loss, but which will bear great fruit in the future. This is the enduring Christian journey, one which needs to be offered up in prayer to God's providence.

In a 2006 homily, Pope Benedict XVI said, "in Pentecost the Spirit, with the gift of tongues, demonstrates that His presence unites and transforms confusion into communion." As we move forward into an unsure and sometimes confusing future, let us stay united as the Body of Christ, confident that the Holy Spirit is with us until the end of time. Please accept my heartfelt gratitude for your commitment to the flourishing of our local Church. May God bless and keep all of us as we journey together on the path of discipleship. 

Seeing the Face of God...

Thank

As we get ready for Fr. Jim's retirement, I find myself feeling deep gratitude for the many ways he has touched my life. I remember him coming to the emergency room when my dad died suddenly, him beginning his homily for my mom's funeral by singing "Only This I want but to Know the Lord...", the tears of joy he shed as he prayed with us at Christmas Mass, the first time he was back after breaking his foot more than three weeks earlier... I remember drive-thru sacraments of the sick, weddings, funerals, baptisms—lots of baptisms—First Communions and the time he needed help opening the sacramental oil at Confirmation. He's a prankster and a master of "groaner" puns. His laughter echoes through the rectory when he shares one of his favorites. He loves his rescue dogs even though they're often a step ahead of him. He can be forgetful like the time he locked his keys in his parked and running car and had me come to bail him out. Sometimes we have locked horns, but this has always ended in discussion and reconciliation. Jim is humble, holy, and like all of us, very human.

Thinking about Jim reminds me how much God interacts with and loves us through each other with all our strengths and flaws and I have a new awareness and gratitude that God came in Jesus to live with us in the ordinariness of our lives and the brokenness of our humanity.

If we look, we can find God alive and loving us in so many places. For example, in addition to recognizing the face of God in the gift of my family being part of our wonderfully diverse parish has blessed me abundantly, more than I ever could have imagined

I always wanted to visit other parts of the world and meet the people who lived there but I still have a passport that's never been stamped. Yet people fleeing gangs and violence in Latin America and refugees from genocide in Africa are now a real part of my family as we pray together around the Eucharistic table. We have come to love, trust, encourage, celebrate, and grieve together and also be playful with and tease one another just like brothers and sisters do.

When my daughter got married the entire community was invited and though I fretted about whether there would be enough for the ever-increasing crowd, somehow there were left overs. There was food and song and dancing and everyone had a wonderful time. One of our Guatemalan parishioners wanted to share his wedding with his parish family and he and his wife got married at Sunday Mass with Anglo parishioners as witness. Then we all joined together for a reception in the undercroft with Guatemalan food served by youth of the community.

We have wept together over deaths, prayed with each other when we were sick, rejoiced in the births of new babies, some of whom had been prayed to life by the community. We've learned to sing and praise God in multiple languages and to dream together about ways we can further become one.

We've had blips and misunderstandings along the way, but somehow as we have been able to work things out and grow. In our broken humanity, there is holiness and God is present.

We look to a new and unknown future as we join with other parishes in our Beacons of Light family I am sure that as we come around the Eucharistic table together and open our hearts to each other, we will find God present and alive and our hearts will expand to welcome everyone home.
