Do we really mean "Peace be with you"?

My Sisters and Brothers of the Risen Lord,

In the Christian tradition, Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of our Church, is the celebration of the Holy Spirit descending upon the apostles, Jesus' mother, Mary, and other followers of Christ who were gathered in an upper room following his death. This story is told today in our first reading in the second chapter in the Acts of the Apostles. I ask you to listen to the tone and language of this narrative because it describes fully the transformational power and strength that conjoin with the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. This power will assuage grief and move us forward in space and time, armed with the knowledge that God is within us—always. This force has been given to everyone, then and now, as the spirit of truth, light, and faith is imbued in our hearts.

And yet, today, we reflect, as well, on the Gospel of John, and rather than "driving wind" and "tongues of fire," Jesus gives us another powerful message: "Peace be with you." What beauty and elegance in these words—peace be with you. It is a simple yet profound phrase, and if we truly embrace its meaning, we will be equipped well to know a softer side of existence and an effective way to accept the vagaries of this world.

Human beings crave a sense of peace, and it is why we turn to the "cures" of the world to help us obtain it. From the peace pipe to the peace sign to self-help books to physical calming techniques or exercise, we are on a never-ending road to find "calm" within ourselves and in our relationships with others. Even at Mass we relive Christ's words as we offer the sign of peace to those in our midst. "Peace be with you," we say, but is it a rote gesture on our part or is it something we have thought about and mean? Think about it. Peace be with you, and to all of us, when imploring the Holy Spirit to guide our path and send us forth to proclaim the universal message of our Lord Jesus Christ and share his mission in the world.

"Come, Holy Spirit, come. And from your celestial home, shed a ray of light divine. Come, Father of the poor. Come, source of all our store. Come, within our bosoms shine. You, of comforters the best; you, the soul's most welcome guest; sweet refreshment here below. In our labor, rest most sweet; grateful coolness in the heat; solace in the midst of woe. . ."—the beginning sequence of Veni, Sancte Spiritus Yours in Christ,

Life in its earliest and most vulnerable stages is threatened by groups proposing an amendment to the Ohio Constitution for the November 2023 ballot to expand and enshrine

abortion at the expense of protections for preborn children and women. The Catechism of the Catholic Church proclaims that "human life must be respected and protected absolutely from the moment of conception." The Church accompanies and supports women facing unexpected pregnancies and mothers through programs such as Walking with Moms in Need and the services of Catholic Charities.

The bishops of Ohio strongly encourage Catholics statewide to unite in prayer and work to defeat this proposed amendment and its grave consequences for women and preborn children in Ohio. 
