"Think, and pray, and know your truth"

My Sisters and Brothers of the Risen Lord,

There are many expressions in the English language—"standing on the sidelines," "not lifting a finger," "sitting on one's hands," "burying one's head in the sand," "not giving two hoots"—and all of these idioms imply the same concepts: complacency and ambivalence. We use excuses for these attitudes: "It's not my problem," "it's someone else's fault," "I am going to stay out of it," and more. These may be sensible idioms, perhaps, but certainly they are not in the realm of caring about other people and what they may need from us. And truly not evocative of Christianity, because we all are entrusted with Jesus's work of proclamation and healing that he demonstrated to us over 2,000 years ago. In Jesus's name and with his grace, we are called to action.

Today is the Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, and in Matthew's Gospel Jesus calls his disciples by name and commissions them to go forth and "make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand.' Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, drive out demons. Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give." These are not words for just twelve individuals who were named to continue the mission of Jesus Christ; these are instructions to all of us as disciples of Christ.

In this raging and ever-changing world of today, we need to think about and pray for the courage, patience, and energy toward emulating our lives in Jesus's image. It is not just words we need to hear; it's words we need to live. How many times during the day, for example, are you faced with a choice of offering yourself in service to another person? Are you always kind? Or, because you are busy and concentrated on your own self-interests, are you disconnected, perhaps even cruel? It is so easy to brush off what one should be doing, yet in these single, fragile moments, doesn't your ultimate choice truly define you and your relationship with the Lord? Think, and pray, and know your truth.

In all you do in life, you are God's apprentice-in-training as you learn to navigate through the world with grace, hope, and love. It's easy to be faithful in silence; it's much more difficult to step forth in the world and take someone's hand or offer them your heart. Lifting a finger will help you lift up the world. We all need to do this and remember: "Do not worry about how you are to speak or what you are to say. . .for it is not you who speak, but the spirit of your Father speaking through you" (Matthew 10:19-20).
