It has made a huge difference to what we can do to help our friends in need in the most remote areas of the world, as well as to offer them tools toward a faith-filled life. As St Francis of Assisi said with these inspiring words: "For it is in giving that we receive;" and each of us, in our own way, has experienced the joy in such actions. Let us be generous today.
