October 30, 2022 My Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord,

Is your heart in the right place? In today's Gospel we look at such a man, Zacchaeus, who Jesus acknowledges by name as having the goodness of heart to attain his eternal salvation. As the chief tax collector, the crowd following Jesus in Jerico viewed Zaccheus as a sinner, yet our Lord expresses a far different view. He understands Zacchaeus to be "a descendant of Abraham," who, through his immediate declarations of repentance, his genuine humility, and surprising joyous nature, is able to transform his life for the greater good. This rich man of short stature only receives the richness of heaven because he relinquishes his claim on his earthly bounty and generously offers recompense to the poor and to those he has defrauded. He scampers up a tree to get a glimpse of Jesus Christ but he ultimately receives far more than he had intended. Zaccheus exemplifies Jesus' words, "For the Son of Man has come to seek and to save what was lost." (Luke 19:10)

It is the Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time and today we should think about our own hearts and whether we can change things about ourselves that may not be in keeping with Christ's teachings. We'd like to think we do all we can, but do we? For example, some of us are quick to judge another person's motivations or actions, but do we take the time to look into that person's heart before expounding on their worth? One of author Wayne Dyer's well-known quotes is "If you change the way you look at things, the things you look at change." And it is in keeping with that thought, we must examine our own lives for ways we can evolve to be better and brighter people, with generous, kind, and accepting hearts, just like Zaccheus demonstrated so many years ago.

We look at Zacchaeus in the tree today: it's ridiculous, but it is an act of salvation. And I say to you: if you have something weighing your conscience down, if you have done many things, stop for a bit and think that there is Someone waiting for you ... cling onto the desire to be forgiven ... I tell you that Jesus never gets tired of forgiving . –Pope Francis
